



Health Issues

The peoples of Lamu, Kenya are in dire need of qualified health professionals. In coastal Kenya, the doctor to patient ratio is 1 to 51,155. Chronic illnesses such as HIV/AIDS, respiratory infections, heart disease, and strokes are devastating the healthcare system.

Maternal mortality is another concern and is estimated to be as high as 1,000 deaths for every 100,000 births. Infant mortality is estimated at 54 in every 1,000 births.

The adult illiteracy rate is as high as 62%, which significantly complicates the management of chronic illness such as diabetes--a growing healthcare problem in Kenya.

Our focus is on early screening and health education across the lifespan. Our motto is to deliver low-cost, high-quality preventative healthcare, one person at a time.
